Summer Book Club Recap

For those of you who participated in our summer book club and finished the book of your choice, congratulations! It is our prayer that it was encouraging and helpful to your understanding of the big-picture story of redemption, centered on Christ. As we bring the summer to a close, I wanted to mention some important takeaways from each book. There will be some overlap, but each complements the other well.

God's Big Picture

The Bible is ultimately one story, with one author, centered on the Person and work of Jesus Christ. The Kingdom of God is one of the main unifying themes of the whole Bible and includes three main aspects:

- God's people
- In God's place
- Under God's rule & blessing

In God's progressive revelation, this theme develops and grows over time (from 'a seed to a flower'). Moreover, in God's developing story, things never go backwards (i.e., there is never a return to an earlier, provisional stage of the story; things always move toward ultimate fulfillment in Christ [in His 1st and 2nd comings]). There are helpful summary charts of the development of the Kingdom of God on pages 158 & 167 (we are living in stage #7 – the proclaimed kingdom)

WHY PSALMS?

For our worship services we have been given much freedom in decisions about music. We have guidelines in scripture concerning content (truth) and style and presentation (beauty). Ephesians 5:19 says that we as a congregation should be "addressing one another in psalms and

Ephesians 5:19 says that we as a congregation should be "addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart." We have been doing well with hymns, songs of praise to God, and spiritual songs, songs about our life in Christ. We often leave out psalms, though. Remember? There is a "song book" provided by God, 150 psalms in the bible!

We don't know for certain what the music accompanying the psalms sounded like. And it seems like the psalms or lyrics were used with different tunes and that the words were arranged to fit a tune. But we are going to do our best to employ the Psalms in an understandable and musically familiar way. So, on many Sunday mornings we will sing a psalm in our order of worship, maybe one that has been sung for centuries to a hymn tune or one which is brand new, or one which our musicians arrange themselves. God gives us a command to include psalms in our worship and his instruction is for our good. Let's wash our souls and minds with his word sung from our grateful hearts!

Far As the Curse Is Found

'Covenant' is also one of the main unifying themes of the whole Bible—ultimately, it involves God's relationship with His people Christianity is not merely a religion of eternal ideas or an abstract philosophy, but the historical unfolding of God's covenantal involvement in the world

There are four main elements in the storyline of the Bible:

- Creation
- Fall
- Redemption
- Consummation / New Creation

The resurrection of Christ & the Exodus are fundamental events in the storyline of the Bible

- Exodus—pattern of redemption of God's covenant people
- Resurrection of Christ—the plot ultimately turns on this event in time-space history

Covenant development

- Covenant of creation / works (Genesis 1-2)
- Covenant of grace (Gen 3:15 onward)
- Noahic covenant
- Abrahamic covenant
- Mosaic covenant
- Davidic covenant
- New covenant (fulfillment in Christ)

<u>Caution</u>: The enemy often tempts us to 'decontextualize' the Bible and understand it in a disconnected and fragmented way. Once we do, we lose the 'center' (Christ), and often substitute a counterfeit 'center' (usually ourselves—i.e., 'the Bible is all about me'). Also, when we cease to interpret Scripture with other Scripture, losing the larger context of the story, we open ourselves up to heresy.

Both books help us to see Christ in the OT. The whole OT speaks of Christ in different ways, whether directly or indirectly. Both books help us to not miss the 'forest for the trees.'
