

STUDENT MINISTRY

Good afternoon, CPC Youth Families!

We pray that you and your family had a wonderful Easter celebration last Sunday and are enjoying a restful spring break this week. Each year, I intentionally look for something new in these familiar Holy Week stories. This year, I found Jesus' lessons to His disciples quite moving as He anticipated the events ahead. He spoke beautifully about service and forgiveness being essential to His disciples' lives in light of his future death, resurrection, and ascension. When Jesus cursed the fig tree after He cleansed the temple, He specifically discussed forgiveness in ways that would comfort His disciples (especially Peter, with whom He spoke about this in Mark 11) after they had abandoned Him at His most vulnerable moment. He also mentions this in the context of the religious leaders rejecting who He is and intentionally leading Israel astray instead of guiding them to Jesus, as they should. Forgiveness will be revolutionary in the lives of those who eventually confess Jesus Christ as Lord, perhaps even within days of shouting, "CRUCIFY HIM!" on Good Friday. The shed blood of Jesus Christ has washed away the guilt of sin for all who trust in Him. Our loving one another and seeking to forgive each other will be one of the most powerful witnesses to a broken and watchful world. May you and I encourage each other to rest in the forgiveness we have in Jesus Christ as we strive to love one another as Jesus has loved us.
